


# How to contribute?

The following instructions will guide you through the process of adding bibliographic data about a magazine or newspaper article to the **Stereoscopy.com Magazine & Newspaper Article Database**, which is located at <http://www.stereoscopy.com/database/magazines>

In order to keep all entries compatible with the database structure, please observe the following rules:

- Author:** Author's Last Name, then First Name (comma-separated); multiple authors separated by semicolon.  
Example: Doe, John; Miller, Sue
- Title:** Magazine/Newspaper Title. If title starts with "The", place ", The" after the rest of the title.  
Example: Washington Post, The
- Volume:** usually indicates the consecutive year since the start of a publication.
- Number:** usually indicates the issue-number within one volume.
- Year:** 4 digits  
Example: 2004
- Issue:** Only used for dated periodicals. Abbreviated month (Jan / Feb / Mar / Apr / May / Jun / Jul / Aug / Sep / Oct / Nov / Dec ) followed by the day (2 digits), if available.  
Example: Mar 02
- Page:** numeric, or alphanumeric  
Examples: 234, E2
- Keywords:** short, descriptive keywords, comma-separated.  
A number of "standard" keywords can be found on the separate list.
